Through tailored programs like "Soporte Entre Pares", community educational initiatives, and an extensive social media presence, we remained deeply engaged in our mission to empower individuals and families. This 2023 report highlights the impact of our initiatives, the resilience of the communities we serve, and our ongoing commitment to advocate for migrants and asylum seekers. In 2023, VIA provided targeted assistance to migrants, with 95% of those served being newly arrived. This reflects an ongoing and substantial increase in new arrivals, consistent with the trend we observed in the previous year.


At VIA, we classify "New Arrivals" as individuals who have entered the United States by crossing the southern border and have been in the country for less than 12 months. This definition allows us to tailor our services to the unique needs and challenges of recent migrants, helping them establish a stable foundation during their first year in the U.S.






#### DEMOGRAPHY

In 2023, VIA supported over 13,000 individuals, with 75% being families or single parents and 71% women aged 25 to 34. This marks a shift from previous years, as our primary beneficiaries are now younger adults and families rather than individuals aged 35 to 50. This evolving demographic enables VIA to refine our programs to address the specific needs of younger families and individuals in our community.








#### DEMOGRAPHY


In 2023, survey data revealed that 51% of the newly arrived immigrants we served were residing within New York City's shelter system. The majority of these individuals are located in Manhattan, making up 55.4% of this population, followed by Queens at 25.9%, The Bronx at 9.6%, Brooklyn at 7.9%, and Staten Island at 1.2%. This distribution enables VIA to strategically focus resources where support is most needed, aligning our efforts with the community's geographical realities.






#### DEMOGRAPHY

In 2023, 59% of the individuals within the community we serve were college-educated immigrants and asylum seekers. Despite their educational qualifications, a significant portion faced challenges in securing employment commensurate with their skills due to their legal status. As a result, many experienced either unemployment or underemployment, reflecting the barriers they encounter in accessing opportunities within







#### **Country of origin:**

It has been truly rewarding to witness the growing diversity within our community. In 2023, we proudly supported migrants from Colombia, Ecuador, El Salvador, Haiti, Honduras, Peru, and Venezuela, reflecting the broad spectrum of cultures and backgrounds that we continue to serve. This growth underscores the importance of our work in providing critical resources and assistance to a diverse range of individuals.



"Disinformation is the biggest challenge that we at VIA continue to face. 

The impact of misinformation and misconceptions about immigration processes in the U.S. cannot be overstated. It creates significant barriers and challenges for many individuals in our community. In 2023, a number of those we assisted were under the mistaken belief that the paperwork they received upon crossing the U.S. southern border automatically constituted their asylum claim. This misunderstanding left them uncertain about their legal status and unsure of the critical next steps they needed to take, further complicating their path to stability and safety.

VIA's Peer Support Program, "Soporte Entre Pares," reached hundreds of new migrants this year, creating a safe space where they find both support and strength. Through 21 online sessions, 10 workshops, and three gatherings attended by nearly 150 people, this program is a beacon of hope. We trained 30 community members in Mental Health First Aid and expanded our WhatsApp community to offer 24/7 support for our growing network (grew from 73 participants in 2022 to 117 in 2023.) Our program is inclusive, transcending national borders to reach migrants in need worldwide, serving not only Venezuelans but asylum seekers of all nationalities.

VIA work with various partners and volunteers to support individuals who want to improve their language skills, which can open up new opportunities. Partnerships with organizations that offer English classes to asylum seekers, TPS applicants, and migrants in the U.S. make it easier for those at higher proficiency levels to access advanced courses.

A remarkable total of 572 individuals from the community embraced these online sessions, exploring English pronunciation and levels from basic to intermediate, alongside tutoring opportunities for children. The selfless contributions of volunteers enriched the English conversation class, nurturing a spirit of growth and connection.



## CHARITABLE ASSISTANCE

In 2023, our "Dando Una Mano" program successfully served over 100 families, impacting an average of 400 individuals. We made a strategic decision to replace traditional food bags with a focus on proteins, grains, and essential nutritious items, along with hygiene products that support the daily needs of these families. This update was crucial, considering the limitations migrants face in shelters regarding food storage, preparation, and cooking, as well as the various food provisions already available in these facilities. This reflects a significant shift from the scenarios of 2021 and 2022.

We have established a dynamic and impactful presence on social media, reaching over one million people in 2023 alone. In Q4, our content connected with 350,000 individuals, while our YouTube channel recorded 90,000 views across 39 informative videos developed in collaboration with trusted partner NGOs.
